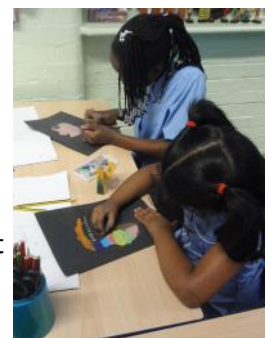
The Nursery children have been looking at snails. They have been finding them in the bushes and in damp places. They have noticed that when it rains they always find more. The children have made a home for the snails and have been observing them. The children have



learnt that a snail has a foot and that it has a fragile shell with a spiral pattern on it. They have loved drawing the snails, practising spirals and have displayed them in the Nursery. The children have enjoyed reading the book 'Snail Trail'.



Year 3 have been enjoying learning all about the Ancient Egyptians this term. They have used hieroglyphics to design their own cartouches and are now creating portraits in an Ancient Egyptian style. Using oil and chalk pastels they have observed and drawn their side profiles before layering and blending colours. The children have learnt about the Egyptian symbols for royalty and included these as head dresses. Our next steps will be to create mixed media self-portraits as pharaohs. The children can't wait to see their final creations!



Year 1 had the marvellous opportunity to use the beautiful grounds at Eltham Environmental Centre to learn about seasonal change. The children looked carefully around the woodlands at the different colours of spring and collect samples to create a special collage. The children also enjoyed feeding Darwin and Wallace (the pigs) - this was one of the highlights for the children. The children made birds' nests out of twigs and leaves they had collected during their woodland walks. It was a wonderful day for children, staff and parents.



The Reception children were delighted when Priya, the librarian at Downham Library, came to visit. She brought a huge selection of picture books for the children to borrow and also read stories to a rapt and attentive audience of Reception children. The children gave her a wonderful welcome and Priya said she would definitely come back again.



Downham Library runs a number of sessions for the under 5s as well as activities during the holidays.

Year 6 kindly made 'Enjoy the Royal Wedding' cards for residents of a local care home. The children were very creative and imaginative with their red, white and blue paper. The residents very much enjoyed looking at the cards that the staff displayed around the home. The staff thanked the Year 6 for their kindness and effort in making such lovely cards. The cards certainly brightened the home as the residents enjoyed a special Royal wedding tea.



Year 2 visited Pizza Express in Beckenham by bus for a morning of learning, tasting and making. Before they got chopping and tasting, the manager explained some important cooking basics - things like washing hands, and staying safe in the kitchen. Next the pizzaiolo (pizza chef) took over, showing the children how to make a famous, Italian classic: the Margherita. Everyone had the chance to knead the dough, making it lovely and smooth, and create the perfect base. The children discovered just how important the fresh ingredients are to the pizza's flavour. The final touch? Topping their creations with passata (tomato) sauce, mozzarella and basil. Whilst the pizzas were cooking the children learnt all about different ingredients and took part in a quiz. Once the pizzas were cooked the children took them back to school for lunch, along with a Junior Pizzaiolo Certificate as the children are now little pizza chefs! What a great morning out.
