## Unicef Convention on the Rights of the Child

Article 4 states that governments must do all they can to make sure every child can enjoy their rights by creating systems and passing laws that promote and protect children's rights.

Article 41 states that if a country has laws and standards that go further than the present Convention, then the country must keep these laws.

#### <u>Choir</u>

Mrs Ley, our music teacher, will continue with choir practice this term each Thursday commencing next week on **Thursday at 8:30am**. This is being offered to children in years 4-6. This will offer great opportunities throughout the year for the children to take part in various musical events. If your child is interested in joining the choir, please visit Parent Pay to sign up. There is no charge to join the Choir. Once your child has signed up, it will be expected that they attend weekly. If your child is unwell or no longer wish to attend choir, you must notify the School Office.

#### School Uniform

Footwear must be black or navy, strong and sensible in style, no boots are allowed. Trainers should only be worn for games or during lunchtime in the playground. Open toed sandals must not be worn in School.

All clothing must be marked with the child's name so that lost clothing may be traced and returned quickly.

Hairstyles are to be conventional in style, length and colour. Hair which is shoulder length or longer must be tied back and hair accessories must be small, simple and navy or pale blue in colour. Jewellery, including earrings, a not permitted though watches may be worn. Children who walk to School without an adult are allowed to bring a mobile phone to School, these must be handed in to the School Office at the start of the day.
