Next week we are holding a sports week in school. There are activities planned for the entire week and therefore children must come into school wearing their school PE kit each day. Please note that no other kit may be worn. The week will culminate in our annual Sports Day at Sedgehill School Sports Field.

On Friday the day will begin at 9.30 where children will take part in a carousel of activities. Children should come to school as usual to be registered, they will then go up to the playing field, any parents able to accompany them on the walk would be most appreciated.

Children who have a school meal will be provided with a packed lunch, if you would rather provide your child with their own lunch for this day, please let the school office know. Those children currently on packed lunch will need to provide a packed lunch on that day too. Children should also have a sun hat and sunscreen applied before the start of the day. Alternatively, if the weather is cold or wet they should have a fleece or jacket to wear. Once the sports activities are complete, children can be dismissed from Sedgehill Sports Field. Parents must let the Class Teacher know that they are taking children from the playing field. Any children remaining with school staff will be taken back to school to be dismissed at the usual time of 3.15PM. Nursery children are warmly invited to join the Sports Day with their parents at 9.30AM, they should make their way directly to the sports field on Sedgehill Road and can be taken home when they are finished. # Unicef Convention on the Rights of the Child

# Article 2 (non-discrimination):

The Convention applies to every child without discrimination, whatever their ethnicity, gender, religion, language, abilities or any other status, whatever they think or say, whatever their family background.



# Article 8 (protection and preservation of identity):

Every child has the right to an identity. Governments must respect and protect that right, and prevent the child's name, nationality or family relationships from being changed unlawfully.



# Article 30 (children from minority or indigenous groups):

Every child has the right to learn and use the language, customs and religion of their family, whether or not these are shared by the majority of the people in the country where they live

## Parent Training

We have two fantastic opportunities for parents to gain greater knowledge and understanding of a range of topics related to the difficult job of raising young people.

In September 2024 we will be running a series of Parent Workshops to help with building relationships and strategies to help with behaviour, we know parenting can sometimes be tricky and we all need a little help from time to time. More details to follow.

There is also a Metropolitan Police initiative to help parents and professionals deal with identifying signs of County Lines, gang affiliation, grooming and exploitation. The input will also include a lived experience speaker who will explain how they themselves or their children, became involved with County Lines and/or exploitation. Whilst at primary age you believe it will not be relevant to your family it is always best to be prepared and know how to spots signs of such behaviour.

Training for parents will be on Tuesday 9th July at 7:30pm. This event is open to Lewisham residents to attend.
